## SECTION 01010 SUMMARY OF WORK

### PART 1 – GENERAL

#### 1.1 INTRODUCTION / BACKGROUND

This contract is issued for the performance of delivering lubrication, oil and coolant products to the Environmental Restoration Disposal Facility (ERDF) - Truck Maintenance Facility (TMF) in support of Central Plateau Cleanup Company (CPCCo) work scope for the period October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2026. CPCCo is a prime contractor to the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and all work on this Statement of Work will be performed in support of the CPCCo contract with DOE.

#### 1.2 DESCRIPTION OF WORK - GENERAL

Contractor employee(s) shall be responsible for independently planning, organizing, and performing the delivery of products in an acceptable manner and in accordance with all provisions of the contract. CPCCo's actual needs will fluctuate over time.

1.2.1 Work is in the 600 Area of the Hanford Site and is located approximately 20 road miles northwest of Richland, Washington.

1.2.2 Work consists of providing lubricants, oils, and coolants to the Environmental Restoration Disposal Facility (ERDF) truck Maintenance Shop (TMF).

#### 1.3 DESCRIPTION OF WORK - SPECIFIC

1.3.1 Included Work: The following identifies major work elements only.

1.3.1.1 Provide and manage labor, equipment, material, and services required to complete work. Labor includes participation of Contractor's employees in training and medical examinations required by Contract for the following:

- Delivery to TMF of requested oil, lubricant and coolant products
- Deliver all listed items within one business day
- Provide updated Safety Data Sheets as soon as possible for all items
- Pick up empty drums/containers as needed/directed
- Provide two - 250 gallon bulk tanks with pumping set-ups for bulk oil and bulk hydraulic fluid

Note – no product substitution is allowed without prior approval by CPCCo.

- 1) Contractor shall also provide two (2) 250 gallon bulk tanks with pumping set-ups for bulk oil and hydraulic fluid at no charge during the period of performance for the contract. At the end of the period of performance these tanks will be returned to the contractor who will remove them from the site at their expense.
- 2) Should any of the above listed items become unavailable the contractor shall notify CPCCo as soon as possible.
- 3) Should a listed product name, product code or package size change the contractor shall notify CPCCo as soon as this change is known.
- 4) Changes to this list after the contract is issued must be requested using the CPCCo - Change Form as directed in contract Part IV, Section 1.17.
- 5) Prices shall be all inclusive (including delivery, etc.) and shall be fixed for the duration of the contract.

The Contractor shall establish an inventory level adequate to meet the one-day delivery criteria. The deliveries will be made to the 6618-D Facility at the corner of 13<sup>th</sup> Street and ERDF Avenue, 600 Area, Hanford Site.

1.4.1 Work will be done on a 4-10’s schedule Monday through Thursday. The standard workday shall consist of 10 hours of work between the core hours of 6:00 AM to 4:30 PM. No work occurs on Facility Closure Days. If schedule alternative is required, BTR will communicate to Contractor contact.

1.4.2 The Contractor will have access to the job site based on the terms of the Contract.
