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**Hanford Site Subcontracting in 2010 Topped \$1 Billion**

*Subcontracts awarded to more than 7,000 companies*

RICHLAND, Wash. – Prime contractors to the Department of Energy Richland Operations Office awarded more than \$1 billion in subcontracts to more than 7,000 companies in fiscal year 2010 to support environmental cleanup at the Hanford Site in southeast Washington State. Contractors reported the following information from October 2009 through September 2010 to the Department of Energy.

**CH2M HILL Plateau Remediation Company**

- Total amount subcontracted: \$676 million, including 51 percent (\$342 million) to small businesses
- Total number of subcontracts awarded: 5,856
- 2,600 of those subcontracts, valued at \$424 million, were awarded with American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding, with approximately 49 percent (\$206 million) to small businesses

**Mission Support Alliance**

- Total amount subcontracted: \$182 million, including:
  - 54 percent (\$98 million) to small businesses
  - 66 percent (\$121 million) to local businesses
- Total number of subcontracts awarded: 1,100 subcontracts
- The company does not receive any direct American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding for procurements

**Washington Closure Hanford**

- Total amount subcontracted: \$209 million, including:
  - 94 percent (\$196 million) to small businesses
  - 61 percent (\$128 million) to local businesses
- 153 subcontracts funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act were awarded with a combined value of more than \$58 million
