PALM BEACH GARDENS, FL—Firefighters from the Hanford Site recently competed in the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society’s Firefighter Stair Climb event and finished in seventh place in fundraising, raising \$21,699.86 to benefit this worthwhile cause. The team is currently eighth in fundraising in the world for the society’s Stair Climb events.

The team completed the event in 49:56, earning them the spot as the 42nd place finishers out of the 170 teams from various states countries. At 788 feet of vertical elevation Columbia Center is the second tallest building west of the Mississippi.
